

# 100<sup>th</sup> Day of School Ideas

Below are a list of 100<sup>th</sup> Day of School activities provided by our ELA/SLA Department:

## Mannequin/Tableau Challenge

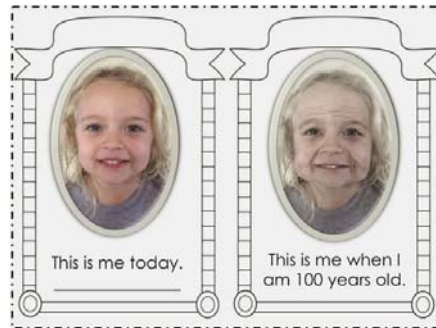
In a tableau, participants make still images with their bodies to represent a scene. A tableau can be used to quickly establish a scene that involves a large number of characters. Because there is no movement, a tableau is easier to manage than a whole-group improvisation – yet can easily lead into extended drama activities. It can be used to explore a particular moment in a story or drama, or to replicate a photograph or artwork for deeper analysis.

<https://youtu.be/ZP6QD0RxNP4> . In groups students can devise a tableau on a specific theme, such as epic books, stories or movies, famous locations or well-known historical events. The other students then try and guess what the tableau represents. Have students re-enact scenes from a book for 100 seconds.

## Oldster

## Read-aloud

- Read *One Hundred Is a Family*, by Pam Munoz Ryan, to your students. Ask them to draw a picture of their families.
- Read *One Hundred Hungry Ants*, by Eleanor Pinczes, to your students. Help them make a book of 100 different bugs.

## Kids 100<sup>th</sup> Day of Mosaic and Writing Essay

Have students bring in a self portrait or draw one. Cut it up into 100 pieces and glue onto construction paper. Have students write about either of these:

- 100 things they'd like to do
- 100 places they'd like to visit
- 100 words about who they are and what they'd like to be.

Often, news outlets post "100 Places to Live". Why not challenge your students to write 100 reasons to live in their town or county? Create a bulletin board. When you take down the bulletin board, make a book of students' work. The local Chamber of Commerce might want to keep a copy of this book or to create a brochure based on your students' work.
