

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Close Up's Austin Academy is designed to bring the democratic process alive for students by providing hands-on opportunities to examine the history and government of the state of Texas. Using simulations, visits to key historic sites, and a variety of workshops, students will deepen their understanding of how the three branches of government interact, learn what it means to be an engaged citizen, and begin to develop the skills necessary to make a difference in their own communities.

PROGRAM GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Austin Academy aims to build students' sense of connection to the rights and responsibilities of citizens in a democracy. Over the course of three days, students will learn about Texas's history, undertake a hands-on examination of the structure and functions of Texas state government, and visit a university campus. Throughout the program, students will gain a greater understanding of effective citizenship in a democracy and of the impact that the state government has on their lives. Specifically, Close Up will help students meet the following objectives:

Objective 1: Understand the three branches of government and develop an in-depth understanding of the legislative process.

Key Components include:

- **Three Branches of Government Workshop:** Students will build a foundational understanding of how Texas government functions.
- **Mock Legislative Session:** Students will debate current policy issues and take on the role of Representatives in the legislative process as they simulate a session of the Texas House of Representatives.
- **Texas State Capitol:** Students will tour the Texas Capitol, examine where the legislative process actually takes place, and engage in fun, history-focused activities at the Visitors Center.

Objective 2: Develop a greater understanding of Texas history and how historical context has influenced the current government structure.

Key Components include:

- **Bullock Museum of Texas History:** Students will take part in a guided exploration of the Museum's three gallery floors and discover the personal stories of the people, places, and events that shaped the state of Texas.
- **Pioneer Farms:** Students will have the opportunity to visit one of six themed historic areas, such as an 1873 Texian Farm or an 1887 Cotton Planter's Farm. Each unique site will take them back in time to experience Texas history first-hand.

Objective 3: Expose students to the importance, possibility and achievability of higher education.

Key Components include:

- **University of Texas at Austin:** Students will visit and tour the campus of the University of Texas at Austin with Close Up staff, where they will experience what a college campus is like and discuss the importance and attainability of a college education.

Objective 4: Provide students with the background, tools, and context to become active citizens in their own communities.

Key Components include:

- **Characteristics of a Good Law Workshop:** In order to prepare students to consider issues and identify potential solutions for problems in their own communities, students will participate in a small-group workshop, assess the strengths and weaknesses of laws, and come up with criteria for creating effective legislation.
- **Community Action Workshop:** Students will examine ways citizens can make an impact in their local community. Students will identify key issues in their own communities and begin to develop a plan for action.

ABOUT CLOSE UP
